Welcome to the School District of Waukesha! We are excited to announce that our district has moved to a centralized enrollment process. What exactly does this mean? Parents or guardians that have a student or multiple students new or returning to our district will enroll at one location versus registering each student at their assigned home school. “Enrollment” is a one-time only process and should not be confused with the annual registration that takes place every August for students who completed the previous school year at a School District of Waukesha school.

In addition to enrolling students, the Enrollment Office can assist you with: address changes, tuition waivers, school choice, transportation and the open enrollment process.

What we have to offer...

We are proud of our schools and the many exciting and innovative programs the School District of Waukesha has to offer. This communication will highlight the opportunities our District can provide for students and how to access them. While it is only January, it is time to start thinking about enrollment and registration for the upcoming school year. Every child who is a resident of the School District has access to their neighborhood school, but we offer an opportunity for students to access schools other than their neighborhood school through “School Choice.” In addition, Wisconsin's open enrollment legislation allows students from other school districts to attend our schools.

Future for Waukesha 4K

Early Learning Programming will prepare children to be 21st century learners through high quality education that honors the uniqueness of each child and family. We will assure child-centered, play-based environments that start each child on the path of lifelong learning. Our 4K program is school and community based. Our school-based classrooms are located at Waukesha Early Learning Center (formerly White Rock Elementary) and we partner with eleven different community sites such as childcare programs, private schools, and area pre-schools. Dual Language 4K may be offered at limited sites. A Bilingual Teacher will deliver 100% of instruction in Spanish. See the Dual Language section of this publication for more information about the Dual Language Program at 4K, and 5K-5th.

Enrollment for the 2014-15 4K will take place ONLINE between February 10 and March 7th. You will fill out registration forms online on the 4K website at waukeshaearlylearningcentersdw.weebly.com. Once you've finished all required areas of the form and submitted electronically, you will then need to submit in person your child's birth certificate and your proof of residence to the school district. You may do this at the Waukesha Early Learning Center Main Office, or at the School District of Waukesha Enrollment Office at the Lindholm building, 222 Maple St, 53186. Your online registration will give you a number and that number will be entered into the lottery once your child's birth certificate and residence are verified.



There will be a public lottery to determine placement for your child in 4K, based on the preferences you indicated when you filled out your registration forms online. The public lottery will be held at the Waukesha Early Learning Center on the last Friday in March. Confirmation/commitment letters will be mailed the following week. This process replaces the mass registration day for the 4K that was held in previous years.

Kindergarten



Preparing students in the School District of Waukesha for college, or a career, and supporting our community continues with the child centered kindergarten experience and opportunity that takes place in the School District of Waukesha's elementary kindergarten classrooms. The kindergarten classrooms offer a supporting and nurturing environment for academic and social/emotional growth that provides a continuing foundation for each child.

If your child is not enrolled in the School District of Waukesha's 4K program, please stop into the Enrollment Office (Lindholm building, 222 Maple Av) to enroll your child in Kindergarten. Kindergarten enrollment will take place the month of January. Please see Enrollment Office (page 12) for the required documents to enroll your child.

Dual Language Program

The School District of Waukesha Dual Language program allows students to develop proficiency in two languages by receiving instruction in English and Spanish.

The Dual Language 2-way classrooms are comprised of half native English speakers and half native Spanish speakers. Dual Language 1-way programs are comprised of native Spanish speakers. Dual Language Programs provide both sets of students with ample exposure to two languages, allowing them to progress academically in both languages and gain an appreciation of another culture.

Dual Language 4K may be offered at limited sites. A Bilingual Teacher will deliver 100% of instruction in Spanish.

Starting in 5K a bilingual teacher delivers 90% of the instruction in Spanish during kindergarten, leading to 50% of instruction in each language by fourth and fifth grade. All students in the Dual Language program will be proficient readers, writers, speakers, and listeners in both Spanish and English by the end of 5th grade.

Summit View INC is Waukesha's newest magnet school. Our learning community focuses on **I**ntegrating the arts, design and **C**reativity. Students have the opportunity to construct and demonstrate their learning through an art form. Students engage in creative processes that connect art forms to science, math, literacy, social studies and technology to meet evolving objectives in both. Teachers provide consistent high level instruction in Foss Science and rigorous standards in Math and Literacy. Classrooms are filled with interactive, imaginative and integrated teaching methods. Students engage in learning activities that build focus, engagement, collaboration, and include problem solving, reflection, and hands on experiences.

Summit View INC offers many complementary enrichment opportunities surrounding the school day including: filmmaking, drama, juggling, piano instruction, science fair, String Academie', and SVE 12 broadcasting club. Band and Orchestra instruction is available to all 5th grade students within the school day. Summit View INC belongs to the Wisconsin Innovative Schools Network (WISN), and is actively involved in a partnership with First Stage Children's Theater, Milwaukee. What is a Charter School?

Charter schools are public, non-religious, and tuition free schools that have independence so they can be more innovative in their curriculum offerings, yet still provide a structured, disciplined learning environment and be held accountable for improved student achievement. Charter schools bring innovation to Wisconsin public schools and work to revitalize public education in our state.

These schools serve students most in need and provide public educational options and opportunities to families throughout Wisconsin.

Waukesha STEM Academies

The Waukesha STEM Academy (WSA) is a K-8 charter school that inspires over 800 students to become active participants in learning. The school is designed around a S.T.E.M. curriculum brought to life with instructional strategies that engage minds! As a STEM school we have a curriculum focused on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math...or what we call the “WHAT” of STEM education. Equally important is our focus on the “HOW” of STEM, which we define as “Strategies That Engage Minds!” Together the “what” and the “how” come together to create a dynamic 21st century learning environment.

The Waukesha STEM Academy is an instrumentality charter school in the School District of Waukesha. As one of over 200 charter schools in the state, WSA strives to meet its achievement goals as well as its role as a charter school. Because of the success of the WSA, Hawthorne Elementary has partnered with WSA and has now become a magnet STEM school.

To apply at STEM, please fill out the STEM application; to apply at Hawthorne Elementary, please fill out the school choice application. Please Note: All NEW families applying to the Waukesha STEM Academy, a parent/guardian is required to attend one “See it Live” or “Open House” event or schedule a personal tour of the school in December or January before your student’s completed application will be accepted and included in our lottery drawing. Compliance with this provision after the lottery has taken place will allow your student’s name to be placed on the wait list.

What is a Magnet School?

Magnet Schools are free public schools of choice that are operated by school districts. Magnet schools have a focused theme and aligned curriculum to themes like Science, Technology and Engineering (STEM), Fine and Performing Arts. Magnet Schools are typically more “hands on – minds on” and use an approach to learning that is inquiry or performance/project based. They use the district standards in all subject areas; however, they are taught within the overall theme of the school.

Hawthorne STEM Magnet School

Hawthorne Elementary School is committed to combining academic excellence with the joy of learning to help children grow, explore and discover through hands-on and inquiry based collaborative learning in multi-aged classrooms. Where else but in schools are individuals grouped solely on age? Life is a multi-age experience and our goal is to maximize the benefits of interaction and cooperation among children with different experiences and who are at varying stages of development.

We have curriculum components that are focused on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math and are committed to creating a dynamic 21st century learning environment. The FLIGHT Academy

The FLIGHT Academy, at Horning Middle School, is a personalized learning, proficiency-based learning pathway available to sixth through eighth graders for the 2014-2015 school year. Students work in a multi-age setting with an integrated curriculum focused on real-world connections and 21st century skill development. The FLIGHT Academy is not a charter school, rather it functions as a school-within-a-school allowing students to continue taking elective courses with grade-level peers. An emphasis is placed on technology integration focusing on student creation and presentation.

Waukesha Academy of Health Professions

Students attending the Waukesha Academy of Health Professions will be able to:

- Explore their personal suitability for employment in the health care industry.
- Take part in a rigorous, medical oriented curriculum (Project Lead the Way), including methods of basic scientific research and advanced placement opportunities which will prepare them for further study at four year universities or technical schools.
- Receive individual academic monitoring, guidance services, and mentoring to assist in successful completion of the Academy program.
- Study and work in state-of-the-art health/science laboratory facilities.
- Learn about the many careers available in the health care industry from current health care workers and practitioners.
- Participate in job shadowing, youth apprenticeship, and co-op work experiences.
- Have the opportunity for membership in local and national student health and science organizations, and to compete in state and national competitions.
- Receive specialized medical training required for entry level positions in the health care industry.
- Receive career counseling and job placement assistance.

The mission of the Harvey Philip Alternative Charter School (HPACS) is to provide programming for each student which gives them the opportunity to re-engage in schooling, outside employment, and allows them to begin to experience community service.

The vision of the school is to have all students achieve an awakened sense of belonging to their school and community. At Harvey Philip, students in high school who are struggling for whatever reason are given the opportunity to re-connect to school and to themselves through these programs.



Small class sizes give teachers an opportunity to get to know each student as a learner and a person. Students get the attention they need which in turn increases the likelihood of success. The environment is one of safety and support. Students are encouraged to deal positively and constructively with negative emotions. Resources that have helped shape HPACS include Life Space Crisis Intervention training, the Circle of Courage philosophy, and Resiliency training.

Dual Enrollment Academy

The Dual Enrollment Academy program at WCTC was designed to give high school seniors a jump start in high demand occupations, awarding the participant with an employer recognized certificate upon successful completion of the program. Seniors will attend regular classes at their home high school for a portion of the school day but spend the majority of time at WCTC participating in one of three programs: Tool & Die/CNC, Welding/Fabrication, or Printing & Publishing. Depending on the program, students will earn 21-24 WCTC credits, which can be applied to a technical diploma or associate degree.



Students must have a 2.0 minimum GPA, be on pace to graduate, and apply to WCTC. Space in the program is limited. Students can see their counselor for more information.

High School Diploma Completion Program



WCTC High School Diploma Completion Program was designed to give credit deficient but academically capable high school juniors and/or seniors another avenue to successfully complete their high school diploma.

Students must attend a two week “Try College” boot camp during the summer to experience the rigor of college and to determine whether they can meet college expectations of attendance, behavior, and assignment completion.

Students accepted into the WCTC High School Diploma Completion Program will attend school at the WCTC Pewaukee Campus. The School District of Waukesha will provide a core academics instructor and curriculum. The daily schedule will include core academic instruction, technical course instruction, and work-based learning as a Youth Apprenticeship participant.

Upon successful completion of the WCTC High School Diploma Completion Program students will earn a high school diploma from their home school district. Depending on core academic requirements, students may also earn a Department of Workforce Development Youth Apprenticeship certificate, and/or college credits. Students can see their counselor for more information.



Waukesha MADE

This School District of Waukesha program incorporates project-based learning in the areas of **Manufacturing, Auto, Design (Graphics), and Engineering**. Students learn to apply theory to practice as they design, create, build, produce, collaborate, troubleshoot, and solve problems -- skills that will prepare your child to be both college and career ready. Multiple opportunities are available for transcribed credit with WCTC and for on-the-job experience (real world work-based learning) through youth apprenticeship or co-op/internship programs. Located at all three high schools in the Technology and Engineering Department, Waukesha MADE can help students succeed in high school and beyond and be the start to a rewarding career.

Youth Options

Wisconsin's youth options program allows public high school juniors and seniors who meet certain requirements to take postsecondary courses at a UW institution, a Wisconsin technical college, one of the state's participating private nonprofit institutions of higher education. Approved courses count toward high school graduation and college credit.

The program opens the door to greater learning opportunities for motivated students considering a technical career, wishing to begin college early, or preparing themselves to enter the workforce immediately after high school graduation.

The Youth options program requires a student application - postsecondary admittance at the college is contingent on meeting the entrance requirements, prerequisites, and availability of space. Under youth options, a student does not pay for a college course if the school board determines the course qualifies for high school credit and is not comparable to a course already offered in the school district.

Information on enrolling in the Youth Options Program is distributed to all students in grades 9-11 during the months of September and January each year. Please see your guidance counselor for more details.

Transcribed Credit

The School District of Waukesha offers courses in the various curriculum areas that are approved for transcribed or dual credit. This means that students taking these courses at the high school level will receive both high school and WCTC course credit. A transcript is on file for the high school student at WCTC, which they may access and print from WCTC's website. This gives them a head start on college by attending WCTC or transferring those credits to another institution of higher learning. WCTC also has agreements with several four-year universities who will accept some of those classes as transfer credits.

The high school courses follow WCTC's curriculum and use WCTC's textbooks, tests, and resources. Students in a transcribed course do not need to take a comprehensive final exam to earn the credit, nor do they have to pay extra testing fees. They take the WCTC-written tests as part of the high school course

In-District Transfer Requests/School Choice

If you are considering attending a school within the district that is not your neighborhood school, you must complete an In-District Transfer Request form which can be accessed online at: <http://tinyurl.com/a22jbsl>. This form can be printed and completed manually or filled in electronically. After completion, please deliver the form to your home/attendance area school by **March 1, 2014**.

NOTE: Families with students enrolling in KINDERGARTEN or coming from a private/parochial school should complete the enrollment process at the School District of Waukesha Enrollment Office, Lindholm building located at 222 Maple Av, 53186.

NON-RESIDENTS of WAUKESHA

Open Enrollment

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live. The open enrollment application period for the 2014-2015 school year is from February 3-April 30, 2014. **The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2014. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.**

Parents may apply in one of two ways:

- On-line (recommend) at <http://dpi.wi.gov/sms/psctoc.html>
- Although an on-line application is recommended, paper applications may be obtained from the Department of Public Instruction or any school district. Paper applications must be delivered to the nonresident school district. School District of Waukesha applications should be submitted attention to:

Who needs to complete this process:

- Students currently attending a Waukesha school via Tuition Waiver for the 2013-2014 school year.
- Students who have changed residency to a non-Waukesha address between September 1st and February 3rd.
- Students *planning* to move into an address that is outside of the School District of Waukesha between February 1 and September 1, 2014; and wish to stay in the School District of Waukesha.

Note: families that move unexpectedly after April 30th are able to complete a Tuition Waiver form for the following year

What are the required documents that I need to bring with to enroll my child?

- Child's Birth Certificate
- Proof of Residency (see below)
- Previous School Info (Name, Address, Telephone Number)
- Guardianship/Custody Documentation (as needed)
- High School Transcript



How can I provide proof of residency?

At least two of the items below can be used as verification of address. All documents must be current, valid and in the name of the parent/guardian enrolling the student.

Please note: Only one document from each group may be submitted:

Group One

- Mortgage or property deed
- Apartment or home lease
- Filed homestead exemption

Group Two

- Utility bill within the past 30 days
- Utility deposit receipt for new service

Group Three

- Automobile registration or automobile insurance
- Driver's license or Voter registration card
- Department of Health and Human Services document for benefits
- IRS documents from the most recent tax year
- Notarized Residency Verification Form and/or personal visit by designated school district official
- Certified copy of filed petition for guardianship if pending, and final decree when granted
